Inspired by a CAS project that allowed students to anonymously write notes of things they wished they would have said but didn't.

On one side, the artwork shows lips unable to speak due to a restrictive cloth, while on the flip side, all the notes are displayed. This shows how on the outside, they were unable to speak, but their deeper thoughts were hidden behind.







This work encapsulates how one's life is molded by another entity. Dysfunctionality is depicted through a hollow form created from wire mesh. By meticulously using wire, the malleability of the figure is demonstrated. It sheds light on topics like loss


of identity as the figure is faceless, and loss of control. The hollowness of the figure represents the victim's loss of stability caused by an external force, in this case, the light source. Using a light the viewer can direct the figure's head.

Size- 24 cm x 46 cm x 38 cm Medium- Entire form is made with animation wire, and the neck mechanism is made with a 3D printer.





It allows the viewer to look at the exterior and interior, bringing out how the two can be so different, the piece shows how people often focus on the exterior instead of considering seeing the interior which could be dark, conflicted, and confusing. Both aspects can be viewed by the audience by putting their head inside the form.



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The artwork juxtaposes a compass and a hand. Compasses were previously used for fortune-telling, another form of it is palmistry. By combining the functionality of palmistry and a compass, the artwork conveys the idea that the direction of one's life is within their own hands, and it depends on them how one chooses to lead it.
